

Rutgers' general vision on Comprehensive Sexuality Education

It is our goal to establish and strengthen formal and informal evidence based Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) for everyone and guarantee the access and quality of CSE.

We do this by

- Providing gender, cultural, age and development appropriate, accurate and comprehensive sexuality education starting at a young age and throughout the life course (with a focus on < 30 year olds)
- Providing CSE what enables young people to build mutual relationships, to enjoy sexuality and to make well informed choices on sexual and reproductive health and wellbeing (prevention of STI, pregnancies and sexual coercion or discrimination).
- Embedding the principles of CSE (standards WHO) and concepts of sexual and human rights and gender equality in the school curriculum, in programs out of school and online tools aimed at young people.
- Involving a wide range of experts and relevant partners in the developing process, the implementation and evaluation process, with special attention to young people themselves.
- Giving special attention to providing CSE to less accessible groups like out of school children, children with disabilities, migrants, low educated ones, refugees and migrants.
- Guaranteeing by stimulating the implementation of appropriate laws, policies and regulations that everyone can have access to CSE.
